November 2025 Employment Situation

After three months of declines, nonfarm employment in Georgia increased by 1,000 in November 2025. Leisure and hospitality, information, and other services added the most jobs over the month. The sectors that shed the most workers from October to November include professional and business services; trade, transportation, and utilities; and construction.

The leisure and hospitality sector added 2,300 jobs in November after growing by 1,500 jobs in October. The over the month growth in November is concentrated in accommodation and food services with an increase of 1,500 nonfarm workers while employment in arts, entertainment, and recreation gained 800 positions. The information sector expanded by 1,100 jobs in November, following a 300-job contraction in October. The other services sector, including religious organizations and repair and maintenance services, gained 800 additional jobs in November.

Employment fell by 1,400 in professional and business services in November, constituted by a decrease of 1,400 administrative and support services jobs and a 400 job drop in professional, scientific, and technical services that overshadowed the 400 additional jobs in management of companies and enterprises. Trade, transportation, and utilities contracted by 1,000 jobs in November following a loss of 4,800 in October. The construction sector also contracted by 1,000 nonfarm workers over the month.


Over the year, employment in Georgia is up 16,300, or 0.3 percent. Private education and health services (+26,800 jobs), leisure and hospitality (+9,300 jobs), professional and business services (+6,500 jobs), manufacturing (+2,500 jobs), and financial activities (+2,100 jobs) added the most jobs from November 2024 to November 2025.

In November 2025, Georgia's unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted) increased to 3.5 percent over the month. Although Georgia's unemployment rate remains well below the 4.6 percent national average, this is the first month that unemployment has increased in 2025. Over the year, the unemployment rate is down from 3.6 percent in November 2024.



Unemployment rates — Georgia and U.S.




