- 5 Stanley Park Rose Garden

- 9 Ted and Mary Greig Rhododendron Garden
- 11 A-maze-ing Laughter (Laughing Men sculptures)

SCENIC SPOTS AWAY FROM THE CROWDS

Busy beaches and tourist hotspots are great – but sometimes you're looking for something quieter.

- 7 Prospect Point Playing Field & Picnic Area – hiking trails with old-growth trees
- 16 Linnea Beach - a great place to explore the tide-pools and enjoy beautiful views of the city and mountains. Access from Point Grey Parks at Trafalgar St, Volunteer Park, or the Chip Wilson Walkway.
- 18 Jericho Beach Viewpoint - Jericho Sailing Centre parking lot
- 18 The Galley Patio & Grill—low-key waterfront concession
- 19 Spanish Banks – at low tide the beach extends out nearly a mile from the shoreline. Even if the parking lots are full, there's still plenty of room to explore away from the crowds.
- 20 Tower Beach. Access from the stairs at Trail 3 in UBC. Isolated and picturesque. Technically part of Wreck Beach (but without the crowds), Tower is a clothing-optional, northwestern facing beach with incredible views all the way across the Salish Sea to Vancouver Island in the west, and the mountains in the north.
- 25 Shaughnessy Park – Often called Crescent Park, almost never used by anyone, it's a peaceful grassy spot to stop for a picnic before tackling downtown traffic again.
- 27 Habitat Island and Labyrinth

There are plenty of tiny museums throughout the city which even most locals have never seen. Many are even free, or by donation. But call first, as they are only open limited hours.


