1. Academic degrees or diplomas, or relevant certificates held by an applicant. Applicants will earn points <b>ONCE</b> for the highest degree, diploma or certificate. No degrees, diplomas, or certificates combination will be allowed to exceed 15 maximum points in this category. <b>This is a maximum of 15 points.</b>		
AA/AS degree or higher	10	One official transcript from regionally accredited U.S. colleges and universities with degree posted. <b>In Progress not accepted.</b> International college graduates: all transcripts from outside the U.S. must be evaluated by an approved foreign service evaluator such as World Education Service. Work Experience 1000 or more hours in the past 3 years	10	Letter from agency verifying volunteer/work experience. The letter must be on the organizational letterhead with an original signature. The letter must include the applicant's name, start and end dates, number of hours per week (or total hours) and name of department. The letter must also include a description of duties. Applicants who have incomplete information on their work/volunteer verification letters may not be awarded any points.
Work Experience 501-1000 in the past 2 years.	8	
Work Experience 201-500 in the past 2 years.	6	
200+ Volunteer experience in a medical setting, caring for human patients, within the past 2 years. Note: <b>Must take either work or volunteer experience. Not both.</b>	5	
3. Relevant course work grade point average in the following College of Marin courses or their equivalent courses as determined by College of Marin Human Anatomy [BIO 120], Human Physiology [BIO 224], Microbiology [BIO 240], Chemistry for Allied Health [CHEM 110] OR Introduction to Chemistry [CHEM 114] OR Survey of Organic and Biochemistry [CHEM 115], and Reading and Composition [ENG 150]). <b>Minimum GPA for admission to the RN program is 2.0 (ONLY relevant course work used to calculate GPA) This is a maximum of 30 points.</b>		
3.5 - 4.0	30	One official transcript, issued within the last academic year, documenting completion of prerequisite courses and Core Biology's completed (Microbiology, Human Anatomy & Human Physiology) with a grade of C or better. <b>No In-Progress coursework accepted.</b> Pass/No Pass, Credit/No Credit course grades not accepted.

4. Life experience or Special Circumstances. Select up to 3 life experiences or special circumstances. <b>This is a maximum of 6 points</b>		
4a. Disabilities	2	4a. Copy of Student Accessibility Services (SAS) evaluation or letter from physician or psychiatrist documenting disability. The same meaning as use in Section 2626 of the Unemployment Insurance Code.
4b. Low family income	2	4b. Documented eligibility for Cal-WORKS, EOPS, Promise Grant, Cal Grant, Pell Grant or other federal or state, needs based grant.
4c. Need to work	2	4c. Paycheck stub during period of time enrolled in prerequisite courses OR letter from employer on letterhead stationery verifying employment at least part time while completing prerequisites. <i>Example: if you completed BIO 120 in fall 2016 then your letter must reflect you worked during fall 2016 to receive this point allocation. This applies to all prerequisites completed.</i>
4d. Disadvantaged social or educational environment	2	4d. Participation in Extended Opportunity Program and Services (EOPS).
4e. Refugee Status	2	4e. Official document from United States Citizens Immigration Service (USCIS) indicating refugee status has been approved/granted (I-94 card with Refugee Asylum Stamps or I-797 Notice of Action) with refugee status approved/granted.
4f. Difficult Personal or Family Circumstances	2	4f. Written statement from applicant documenting difficult personal or family circumstances with any supporting documentation.
4g. First generation to attend college	2	4g. Written statement from applicant.
4h. Veteran Status	2	4h. Copy of Defense Form DD-214 Honorable Discharge.
4i. Living in a medically underserved area or population, as designated by the federal Health Resources and Services Administration	2	4i. Proof of residence.
5. Proficiency or advanced level coursework in languages other than English. Must show evidence of criteria A, B, or C. <b>Maximum of 4 points.</b>		
Credit for languages other than English shall be received for languages that are identified by the Chancellor's Office. <b><u>These may include but are not limited to the following:</u></b>  American Sign language, Arabic, Chinese including its various dialects, Farsi, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, the various languages of the Indian subcontinent and Southeast Asia, and the various languages of the African continent.	4	A. Official transcript from a US regionally accredited college or university verifying 4 separate and progressive level courses of the same foreign language with a grade of C or better for each semester within the last 5 years. B. If coursework is greater than 5 years, must show evidence of ability to speak, read and write a foreign language. C. Letter on letterhead from clergy, professor, or supervisor, if it is a native language (must be able to speak, read and write in language).
6. Assessment /Readiness test results (ATI TEAS-new version released June 2022). Minimum adjusted individual score required for application is 62%. <b>Only one attempt allowed within 12 months. Maximum Points: 40</b>
