
My highlight this year has been **the campaign to promote our new systematic review on contraception at ICFP in Bogotá**.



## 3 EMBRACING PLEASURE

### A sex-positive and pleasure – inclusive approach to SRHR

Plan International's Embracing Pleasure project – with the technical guidance of The Pleasure Project— brought pleasure to the forefront of SRHR programs for young people in Bolivia, the Philippines, and Zimbabwe (2023–2024).

“I came to understand that accepting pleasure does not mean being careless or neglecting our responsibilities. It allows us to rest, enjoy, and appreciate the simple things that bring us happiness.”

### Building on Plan's endorsement of the Pleasure Principles, the project asked:

how can Plan International further embed a sex-positive and pleasure-inclusive approach within sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) programming and influencing strategies across different country contexts?

### How we did it:

- Participatory research, workshops, and creative methods to explore what shapes sexual attitudes and behaviors
- Examined cultural norms, gender expectations, and access to information to understand young people's experiences of pleasure and relationships
- Amplified youth perspectives to inform program design, advocacy, and guidance

### The result:

SRHR programming that doesn't erase pleasure and scare young people, but makes sexual health something they want to engage with.

# 4 COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE

The Community of Practice has been an incredible source of strength and determination this year.

With 2025 beginning on such a grim note for our field—with the USAID withdrawal and regressive policies emerging across regions — **the CoP has been nothing short of stupendous.**

# 5 UNFPA MEETING IN NAIROBI

Pleasure is no longer the elephant in the room



## The moment

**Nairobi felt like a real shift.** Our Co-Director and Founder was invited into a UNFPA-convened meeting with around 30 people from across the UN system, academia, philanthropy and practice – including IPPF, MSI, Gates, WHO HRP, OECD, Guttmacher, Love Matters Arabic and leading academics. The group was tasked with a big question: **what should replace SDG measures on sexual and reproductive agency after 2030?**

## What was on the table

UNFPA grounded the discussion in the current SDG framework, where Goal 5.6 focuses on **informed decision-making and legal access to sexual and reproductive health care**. Important foundations, but not the whole story. As the conversation opened up, new measures were proposed: **sexual satisfaction, sexual choice and sexual self-confidence**.

What stood out was the level of agreement – **pleasure and satisfaction were not fringe ideas, and UNFPA was clearly on board.**

## Why this matters for us

Nairobi confirmed that **the field is catching up** with ideas we've been building for years. **Sexual well-being is being taken seriously as an asset, not a luxury.** Being in the room strengthened our relationships, sharpened our thinking, and reinforced our role as a credible voice shaping what comes next.

"I was thrilled that The Pleasure Project was asked to literally have a seat at the table of those deciding how pleasure, sexual and reproductive agency will be measured in the post SDG era. And doubly thrilled because of the acceptance that **positively framing the consensual sexual choices that people make is important alongside measuring the reduction in 'death, danger and disease' in the world, and that the UN agrees.**"

# BERLIN PORN FILM FESTIVAL

Berlin Porn Film Festival is one of those rare spaces where the adult industry, policymakers, educators, activists, and researchers actually talk to each other – not past one another. This year, we were right in the thick of it.



At the Adult Industry Forum, our team helped shape some of the most urgent, crowded, and talked-about conversations of the week. With full rooms, sharp debate, and plenty of “we need to keep talking about this” energy afterwards, our presence at BPF reconfirmed something we already know as SRHR practitioners: **porn, policy, pleasure, and education are deeply connected - and ignoring that does real harm.**

Our two panels rocked:

 **Who’s Watching Us Watch? Age Verification, Rights, and the Politics of Porn Access**

Age verification is no longer a hypothetical policy issue; it’s already reshaping how people access sexual content online. From the UK’s mandatory ID checks to proposals in the US and EU, decisions are being made fast, often without the voices of those most affected.

**This panel asked the uncomfortable but necessary questions: Do age verification laws actually make anyone safer? At what cost to privacy, access, and sexual rights? And why is surveillance being prioritised over education?**

With perspectives spanning regulation, digital rights, sex education, and porn, the conversation stayed grounded, practical, and refreshingly free of moral panic. A key takeaway echoed throughout the room: porn literacy and comprehensive sex education are essential tools for online safety, and far more effective than blunt regulatory fixes.

## 🔥 Porn Isn't the Enemy: Reclaiming Sex Education Through Pleasure and Literacy

If you've ever worked in SRHR, you've heard it: porn is blamed for everything from bad sex to broken relationships. This panel pushed back, hard.

Instead of asking how to "protect" people from porn, the conversation shifted to a much more useful question: what becomes possible when we teach porn literacy, not shame? Bringing together educators, scholars, activists, and adult industry voices, the panel explored how porn can sit alongside — not against — pleasure-forward, consent-based, inclusive sex education. **Lived experience took centre stage, especially from communities most often erased from policy and classroom conversations.**

The response was **immediate and enthusiastic**: packed seating, thoughtful questions, and clear appetite for collaboration across sectors that too often remain siloed.



## AFRICA HUB SRHR ALLIANCE KENYA

Rooted in East Africa's advocacy landscape, the Africa Hub is led by SRHR Alliance Kenya, a coalition of organizations championing sexual and reproductive health and rights for young people. Together, we're amplifying pleasure-centered education and fostering research that shifts narratives across the region.

### 9th RHNK Pan-African AYSRHR Scientific Conference - Whose Body Is This Panel

At this year's RHNK conference the Africa Pleasure Hub hosted a powerful panel titled Whose Body Is This bringing together creators, academia and feminist organizations to explore bodily autonomy and pleasure.

By centering pleasure alongside lived experience research and feminist practice the panel challenged dominant narratives of control and shame and reaffirmed that our bodies our choices and our joy are central to justice wellbeing and liberation.



## The Art and Boundaries of Sensual Communication (Talk Sexy) Webinar

This year, The Africa Pleasure Hub, hosted at the Kenya SRHR Alliance, deepened its commitment to pleasure-based, sex-positive approaches in SRHR. Through our webinar "The Art and Boundaries of Sensual Communication (Talk Sexy)", we explored Africa's rich cultural history of sensual expression, from Swahili poetry to West African storytelling, while addressing the modern realities of social media, consent, and stigma.

By linking these, the Alliance highlighted how pleasure conversations, once silenced, can now be a tool for empowerment, respect, and well-being. Grounded in the 7 Pleasure Principles, our work continues to normalize discussions around sexuality, ensuring that people can love themselves, talk openly, and engage in relationships that prioritize mutual respect, rights, and joy.

"The Africa Pleasure Hub rocked at the Adolescent Sexual and Reproductive Health Conference in Mombasa and it was pure pleasure watching the buzz of attention at their booth, future pleasure enthusiasts especially loved the 'Pleasure Apron' a game where they guessed 'Which pleasure principles is this?' and got to rip off the principles and attach it satisfyingly to the Velcro of the apron next to the correct principle. There were more fun and games at the Pleasure evening organised by the hub with people confessing to pleasure secrets all with the good cause of advancing understanding of pleasure based sexual health.

I can honestly say I have never been to such a lively, frank, open and enlightening pleasure and sexual health event, and I'm already looking forward to the next delights that the Africa Hub will be running. I learnt a huge amount and have some new pleasure phrases and practises I will be peppering though my pleasure pep talks."




# LAC HUB Promsex

With decades of work advancing sexual rights, Promsex brings deep expertise in policy, community mobilization, and the joyful reimagining of sexual health rooted in Latin American realities.

By creating a digital platform where evidence-based, culturally grounded, and pleasure-focused resources can be shared across Latin America, the Hub seeks to amplify voices, practices, and knowledge often marginalized in traditional sexual health frameworks.



## ✨ Highlights ✨

This year marked a defining moment for the LAC Pleasure Hub as we began shaping its visual and cultural identity. We developed a brand rooted in Andean aesthetics, drawing from Indigenous weaving traditions, symbols of transformation, and the vibrant colors of our region. The butterfly emblem, inspired by ancestral textile art, captures the spirit of liberation, joy, and bodily autonomy that the Hub seeks to celebrate.

Creating the first regional Pleasure Hub in Latin America, and doing so from Peru, is profoundly significant. We are launching this initiative in a context shaped by conservative narratives that often silence discussions about sexuality and pleasure. This makes the Hub not only timely, but groundbreaking. It represents a commitment to reframe sexual health through a pleasure-centered, rights-based lens and to make pleasure speakable, visible, and politically relevant.

At Promsex, we are deeply excited to bring the Hub to life. In 2026, we look forward to building alliances across the region and nurturing a network of pleasure ambassadors who can spark transformative conversations within their organizations, communities, and countries.


# Key Pleasure Moments
