

New law HB0156 requires proof of 30-day residency and citizenship to register to vote.

The public comment period is open for proposed rules from the Secretary of State's office.

Voter Fraud Is Extremely Rare in WY The System Works!

- 4 voter fraud convictions in the past 42 years
 - 100% of new voter registrations are checked for citizenship by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.
 - 100% of registered voters must show an ID at the polls.

2024 General Election

- 5 non-citizens attempted to vote in the 2024 general election—all were turned away.
- 6 individuals flagged as potential non-citizens, verified their citizenship, and voted.

WY's Safe and Secure Elections: Pre-Election Public Testing, Post-Election Audits, County Canvassing Board Review

1. Pre-Election Public Testing .
2. Post-Election Audits, and
3. County Canvassing Board Review

- Paper ballots provide an audit trail.
- Voting machines do not have a modem.
- Voting machines CANNOT ever connect to the internet.
- All voting machines are publicly tested and sealed before each election.
- Voters fill out their ballots, and the machine tabulates the votes and produces the unofficial election results.
- County Clerks audit the ballots and the tabulating equipment and oversee the County Canvassing Board review and ballot reconciliation.

2024 General Election

- Fremont County Early or Absentee ballots: 6,410 (36.91%) of 17,396 total ballots cast
- Fremont County drop-off ballot box: 596 ballots submitted through highly secure drop-off box.
- Wyoming voters used ballot boxes: 5,000 ballots were submitted throughout the state's highly secure drop-off locations.

To Register to Vote, Use Your Wyoming Driver's License

- WY Real ID driver's license provides proof of citizenship
- 90% of new Wyoming voters use their Real ID to register to vote

Absentee and Early Voting and Ballot Boxes Allow Hard-Working Wyoming Citizens to Vote

- Voters request, complete, and return a ballot in a sealed and signed envelope by mail, in person, or through a drop-off ballot box.
- Drop-off ballot boxes are used by shift workers, caretakers, ranchers, agriculture and energy workers, and rural residents.
- Drop-off ballot boxes provide 24/7, camera-secured access and equal opportunity to vote.

Hand Counting

1. Inaccurate: 58% accuracy level
2. Slow: 3 minutes per ballot, or 9,600 hours for the general election alone in Wyoming
3. Expensive: costs \$3.5 million per general election in Wyoming
4. Inflexible: unable to handle ballot complexity. The 2024 Fremont County general election ballot had 75 elected positions.

Machine Counting

1. Fast
2. Accurate
3. Cost-efficient
