

YOUR HEALTH RIGHTS


The **rights of users of the health system** are enshrined in the Public Health Code (CSP) and in the main laws on patients' rights, in particular the law of 4 March 2002 and its supplementary texts including among which the Accessibility Act of February 11, 2005.

Give or refuse your informed consent





Be clearly informed about each treatment

Request an interpreter if you do not speak French, or a French Sign Language (LSF) interpreter (in hospital)

Information on the Right to privacy and confidentiality of information





Right to file a complaint via the platform "report an adverse health event," or with the facility—Users' Commission (UCC)—the relevant professional council, the ARS or the CPAM)

Be accompanied by a trusted person during consultations, except when an individual interview is required to protect safety, freedom of expression, or in other duly justified and proportionate exceptional cases.
